

The CJGA Mizuno National Junior Golf Championship is the culminating event on the CJGA's schedule, bringing together the top junior golfers representing every province across Canada in an esteemed fourday competition. This event was developed to provide elite junior golfers with an opportunity to compete in a high profile national championship event as well as build their golf resumes.

Tournament Format:

Four rounds of stroke play. After the first two rounds of play there will be a cut of 50% and ties in each of the divisions for the remaining two rounds.

Qualification Process:

Juniors can earn exemptions to the CJGA Mizuno National Junior Golf Championship by the following methods:

- 1. The top golfers from the previous CJGA Mizuno National Junior Golf Championship:
 - a. Bantam Girls Division- Top 5 and ties
 - b. Bantam Boys Division Top 5 and ties
 - c. Junior Girls Division Top 10 and ties
 - d. Junior Boys Divisions Top 10 and ties
- Placed 1st or 2nd (including ties) in any CJGA Junior Tour event during the current season prior to August 1st.
- 3. Winner or runner-up of 2017 CJGA PING Canadian Match Play Championship
- 4. Members of Golf Canada National Amateur & Development teams
- 5. Successful Championship Application players who have submitted a resume
- 6. Special Exemptions as determined by CJGA Committee

Juniors that are eligible to participate must fill out a CJGA Championship Application and sent it to the CJGA Head Office prior to July 20th at 5:00pm EST.
